Greetings!

We all have approached this new year's beginning differently and place credit or blame where we will. We live in a time when lifting oneself up out of the oppressive forces associated with racism, sexism, ageism, classism, nationalism, and even education is admired and we look to strong role models to show us how it is done.

Jesus gave self-worth to the poor and oppressed by reminding them, or, in many cases, revealing to them that God loves them no matter what. That God as Father, Son, and Holy Spirit would be with them always; and we are assured that if God takes care of the birds, then because of God's love for us, imagine how much more God cares for us. (Matt. 6:26-27) Some folks, however, forget to credit God with that care, that blessing, that gift, that uplifting in the midst of forces that would keep us down. Yes, there is a definite measure of our own efforts in the process, but where would we be without God?

Jesus also gave a better perception of self-worth to those who were not oppressed, and even to the oppressors. He let them know that God loves them, too, and that they have been given gifts to share and use for the betterment of humanity and for the building of the kingdom.

He reminds us all that we should never put ourselves above others -- loving each other as we love ourselves and as Jesus loves us. When we have the chance to do good things, we need to do good things! It is how God works through us sanctifying us with God's grace. It is how we give back to God. When we do good, we live out Micah 6:1-8. We remember that while it is earthly things and people that bring us down, it is God through Jesus Christ who lifts us up. It is God through the Holy Spirit who empowers us to lift others, and we must remember to continually praise God and give thanks for all God gives us.

What God Requires -- Micah 6:6-8

"With what shall I come before the Lord, and bow myself before God on high? Shall I come before him with burnt offerings, with calves a year old? Will the Lord be pleased with thousands of rams, with ten thousands of rivers of oil? Shall I give my firstborn for my transgression, the fruit of my body for the sin of my soul?"

He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?



To do that, we lift our voices in prayer and we lift ourselves to help others in Christ's holy mission. God does not want the burnt offerings and things done only for God -- God doesn't need such things. It is God's children who are in need. Worship is not just a time to sing God's praises but a time to recommit IN COMMUNITY each week to the work that Jesus started for God's children. It is a weekly commitment to "do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God" (Mic. 6:8 NRSV) in Jesus' name by being the body of Christ and serving God by serving others.

That is what God requires. That is what God NEEDS because we all NEED each other.

May you all have a blessed and fruitful year in ministry
to and with others in Jesus' holy name!

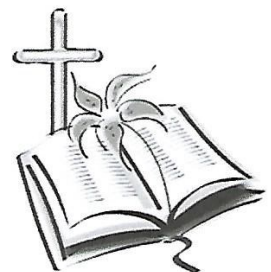

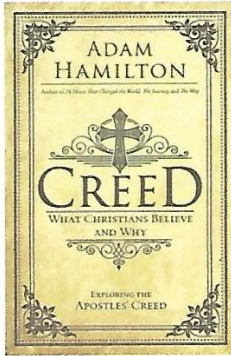

Sunday School

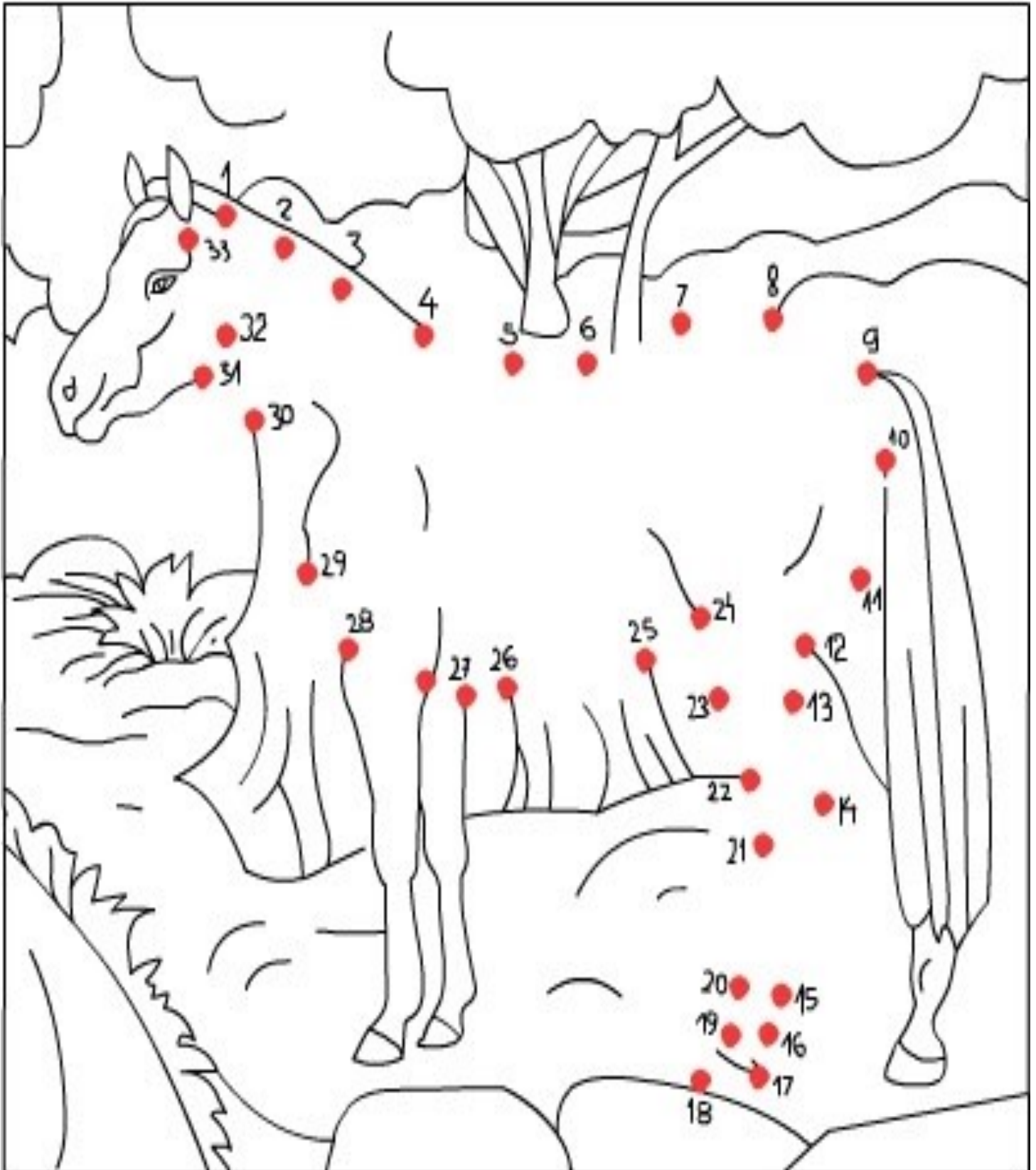

Update from Trustee and Finance Committee

Last spring, the trustees told you about the work that needs to be done on the Parsonage, and the projected costs. We are pleased to tell you that we have met our financial goals, and reduced our costs. Since that time, we have contacted additional contractors and have found:

Side-Rite in Morrisville Pa has given us an estimate of \$9,350 (other was \$18,600). Of course, both of these costs could be higher depending on what is discovered when the shingles are removed – but we have spoken with Side-Rite, asked him to add an estimate for the gutters and gutter-guards and tentatively told him we are interested in signing his contract.

Exterior Improvement, of Langhorne has presented a bid of \$2,330 for replacement of the two garage doors and two electric garage door openers (last estimate was \$3,490). The doors have been ordered and the installment is scheduled for Tuesday, January 28.

The Boy Scouts are in full operation – stop in on a Friday evening and you'll see lots of busy kids. They have installed their new shed on the rear of the property and all is well.

We've had a mini "appliance revolution," the kitchen dryer quit heating but has been repaired, and the freezer on the stage decided it no longer wanted to freeze anything – we were advised that it was not worth the cost of repairing so it has been removed, and picked up by our trash service.

On the Finance side of the church there are some serious issues we need to address (again).

We have approved a budget that is already \$35,000 short of our projected income. There are no extravagant purchases, just bare bones expenses, and we have lost considerable revenue over the past year. We all need to pray for guidance during the upcoming split of the church.

We are going to ask you for continued prayers, donations, and observance of cost – cutting ways we can lower some of our bills. Sometimes we need to think and do things that we do in our own homes – turn off lights when we leave a room, make sure doors and windows are shut, etc.

After **many** years of dedicated service, the Davis and Habel families have retired from counting. While we thank them for their service, we must now look for replacements for the first Sunday of each month. If you are interested and would be willing to be a counter once each month, or know of someone you think may be interested, please contact me – or Kim Stockburger.

February is Audit time – and we need the financial records from UMW, LBE, Youth Group, Boy and Girl Scouts (and any other organization that has independent checking accounts. Please give these records to me, or Kim a.s.a.p..

If you have any questions, or suggestions, feel free to contact me and I will do what I can to explain or respond.
