

This notice is an urgent plea for help making everyone aware that there is a considerable shortfall of funds in the monies promised through the Faith Promise Giving Program for this past fiscal year. As of the end of February giving is behind almost by one-half of what has been promised ... note the giving versus promised chart on the Missions Bulletin Board in Fellowship Hall.

It is both the privilege and the duty of the Christian to send missionaries by means of generous financial gifts. In ways beyond all human understanding of logic or of math, God takes our gifts, multiplies them, uses them, and repays the giver with blessing. As a spirit of selfless generosity is a mark of healthy Christian, so the practice of collective benevolence is indicative of a vital church. The adage, "Show me your wallet, and I'll show you your heart," is as applicable to the church as a whole as it is to the individual.

In over 35 years of ministry, I have never seen a church's operating budget or building program hindered by a thrust for world missions. However, I have frequently watched churches stagnate when the opposite approach has been taken.



#### LANGHORNE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD MEETING March 20, 2017

Meeting was opened with comments and prayer by Paul Hansen.

First item on the agenda was the luncheon for Pastor John. The luncheon committee asked Ad Board if we could use money from the Reserve Giving Fund to supplement the cost of the luncheon. Pete Curtin made a motion that we use the RGF money needed, motion was seconded by Karen Arner, motion passed.

**YOUTH:** (1) Before Pete spoke, Paul commented on how wonderful the service was on Youth Sunday, and what a blessing Pete has been for the youth, and the church over the past 10 years. (2) The 30 hour famine raised \$1,916 for World Vision. (3) Annual Flower Sale is coming up. Flowers will be here for Mother's Day.

**STEEPLE KIDS:** School is full, and going well. We've sent a questionnaire around to the families, waiting for responses.

**MUSIC:** Youth Sunday was mentioned again for the wonderful music.

**COM:** (1) The Good Friday cross walk will begin at Friends Meeting at noon, and will end at Langhorne Presbyterian church. Services begin at 1:30. (2) Bill and Barbara Jordan are working on organizing the Prayer Hotline. Hope to have a couple of hours a week where people can call in. (3) Pancake breakfast will be on Palm Sunday. (4) Holy Thursday there will be a drama skit. (5) Easter Sunday Sunrise Service will be held at Pavilion #6 at 6 AM.

**STEWARDSHIP:** Upcoming activities include bowling and a trip to the Trenton Thunder.

**TRUSTEES:** Last meeting was spent prioritizing the to-do list for this year.

**FINANCE:** (1) So far we are on budget for revenue and expenses. (2) Faith Promise giving has declined in proportion with the general giving. There will be a meeting of the Missions Committee on Saturday to address the issue.

**SPR:** (1) Pastor John pointed out that SPR needs to reassign liaisons. They are also responsible for hiring a new Youth Leader. (2) Paul pointed out that they should try and schedule their meetings before Ad Board, so there is something current to report. (3) The States, Curtins and Raabs are no longer going to be doing the Living Nativity. The Nominating Committee will need to find replacements.

#### ADMINISTRATIVE BOARD MEETING

**NOMINATING COMMITTEE:** (1) The States, Curtins and Raabs are no longer going to be doing the Living Nativity. The Nominating Committee will need to find replacements. (2) Next meeting is March 29<sup>th</sup>.

**DISCUSSION OF NEW IDEAS:** Last month we came up with several new ideas. This month, we received updates as to what has happened so far:

(1) Website Committee: Had a very productive first meeting. Going to meet every three weeks or so to keep the momentum going.

(2) Outdoor Service: No meeting yet, Mike Kephart is doing investigating on how to market the idea. Babs talked about placing ads in the Courier Times. She volunteered to be in charge of this if we decide to do it. She also mentioned that we could have our information placed in a directory placed in the BCCT Discovery Magazine for a one-time fee of \$95. Debbie Letham made a motion that we do this, motion seconded by Karen Arner, motion passed.

(3) Saturday Service: There are no Saturday services around our area, but this idea could be hard to carry out if there is only one Pastor. The feeling is it should be a blended service. It was suggested maybe this idea should be tabled until the new pastor has settled in. There were no objections to the idea, just holding on for a few months.

(4) Sunday School: No meeting as yet. Maybe SPR could post a Christian Education position, where the youth leader would also be the Sunday School superintendent - obviously a paid position.

Our Church Finances Finance Committee, Chuck Boyle, Chairperson February 2017

We have started 2017 right on plan from a financial perspective. Both total revenues and total expenses are very close to budget, delivering a break even bottom line as of the end of February. Our cash position is also positive. This is a good beginning and hopefully the next ten months will fall in line as nicely. We are blessed with a loving and supportive church family.

For the year to date on the revenue side we finished \$700 below our budget. The actual financial report shows a miss of budget by \$3,500 but the February payment from Steeple Kids of \$2,800 was posted in March and should be added back into February, correcting the budget shortfall to just \$700. General offerings exceeded expectations by beating the budget by \$1,400. This is good to see. General offerings came in very close to the same period in 2016. The major differences between our budget and actual revenue are noted below:

- 1. Total offerings are over budget by \$1,400.
- 2. Steeple Kids shared expense payments are reported at \$2,800 below budget but they are really right on budget because the February payment was recorded in March. This timing issue will clear itself up next month.
- 3. Investment returns from the McKay Fund are \$1,700 less than budget. We have checked with the Trustees and they confirmed that there have not been any changes in the way this fund is invested. Most likely it is a timing issue that will correct itself through the balance of the year.

On the expense side for the year we reported \$200 under budget for the first two months on this year. The major differences between our budget and actual expenses are noted below:

- 1. Sexton compensation and supplies are \$400 less than budget.
- 2. Business operations are \$300 less than budget.
- 3. Accounting software expenses are more than budget by \$400. An annual payment for this expense was made to take advantage of a discount. No further expense will be incurred this year.
- 4. Caring ministry expenses are \$500 more than budget, but this should reverse itself next month as reimbursement checks from the Men's Group are expected to cover this overage.

## Our Church Finances (cont'd)

- 5. Youth expenses are \$500 less than budget, but this will reverse itself next month as payments to our youth program will be made in March.
- 6. Payroll processing fees are \$300 less than budget. This is a budget allocation error that should correct itself through the year.
- 7. Postage expense is \$250 less than budget.
- 8. Office Supplies are \$1,000 more than budget. Envelopes and check stock were purchased. This expense occurs only one-time every two years or so.
- 9. Utility expenses are \$200 less than budget.

This leaves us with a net operating gain of \$200 when we add in the revenue from Steeple Kids that was recorded in March but is really for the month of February.

As of the end of February we have \$48,500 in the L.U.M.C. general fund. This is the financial cushion that we need to move forward.

The Reserve Giving Fund continues to grow nicely thanks to our congregation. As of the end of February the balance in this fund is \$5,000.



## **Preparing for a New, Living Heart**

The season of Lent, which began on Ash Wednesday, provides us the opportunity to prepare for the renewal, recreation and resurrection that comes with Easter. "Lent" comes from the Old English word lencten meaning "spring," as in the season of the year, or literally the "lengthening of daylight hours." This season represents the 40 days of Jesus' time in the wilderness being tempted by Satan and preparing for his ministry. Our preparation can include intentional reflection, study, and repentance. The meditation on Ezekiel 36 invites us to examine our hardened, stony hearts and ask for the softening, or healing, that God offers us through Jesus Christ when we repent. Recognizing how our hearts have hardened and asking for renewal is one way we repent.

Hardened hearts affect our ability to reflect God's boundless love to others. At least, a hardened, stony heart makes us indifferent to the suffering of others. At worst, it makes us unreceptive to God's love and God's gift of life through Jesus Christ. As the meditation suggests, pray for a changed heart. After praying, look for ways to act as if you have a softened heart. You might reach out to a member of your Covenant group with whom you are less familiar or with whom you may have disagreed while studying scripture. Offer to spend time listening to him/her. Perhaps suggest an act of service you might engage in together such as preparing a meal for or visiting a shut-in, volunteering one afternoon at a food bank or homeless shelter, completing a small maintenance project at the church, etc. God often works through our actions.
