A Note from Your Pastor...

Greetings and Happy Summer!

Well, I cannot believe it has been a little over a year since I joined this congregation as your pastor (July 1, 2017)! The time has gone by quickly! I am still learning some of your names and the Langhorne area; and I am still moving things from place to place in the parsonage to find just the right spots for them!

In many respects, I still feel a bit new here. I am constantly learning new things about this local church's facility, programs, people (as a congregation family and as individuals), and its overall spirit. I anticipate that will continue well into our many years together. True colors and true personalities have started to emerge as I get to know individuals.

Jesus didn't need to learn about those he met and worked with. Philip told Nathanael of his call from the Messiah to come that Moses and the other prophets spoke of: Jesus, son of Joseph from Nazareth. Jesus surprised Nathanael by knowing him before they even met, even the fact that he was sitting under a fig tree right before Philip met with him. (John 1:43-51) Then there was that all he knew of the Samaritan woman at the well of her life and her sin. (John 4:1-42) And then there was the little man hanging out in a tree to see Jesus to whom he <u>called down by name</u> and said, "Zacchaeus, hurry and come down; for I must stay at your house today." (Luke 19:5b NRSV)

But Jesus Christ is God, and I am human. And while I do get impatient with myself about learning as much as I can about everyone, I am glad I do NOT have that ability of God. Too many things could go wrong with that. Also, it is not just about knowing people, it is getting to know people – it is the journey along the way. And that is a HUGE part of God's plan!

For humans, we are constantly surprising each other with new things about ourselves. It is something we talk about in pre-marriage counseling: the human relationship is ever evolving and we need to change with it as we continue to listen, learn, and grow TOGETHER, perfecting ourselves in Christian love both within the marriage or close relationship, and outside the marriage or with other relationships. Life gets better and better if we are open to letting the Holy Spirit guide us in all aspects of our relationships.

But we need to make a concerted effort to speak to people and to start getting to know them. How many people do you know, even a little bit, at the worship service you do NOT attend?...at the worship service you DO attend? How many people do you know and keep in touch with who are truly homebound (not able to leave their place of residence at all unless with major assistance)? How many people do you <u>sit down and</u>

<u>eat with</u> at the Shared Meal every fourth Monday of the month? Do you attend the meal?

While we cannot KNOW all people as Jesus does, we sure can LOVE all people as Jesus does. That was his New Commandment:

"I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another." (John 13:34-35 NRSV)

And to truly love others as Jesus did, we must get to know each other the best that we can.

I challenge this congregation to get to know one another... to love one another. We are on a journey together. And even if you THINK you know someone, talk with them and learn something new. Do not depend on social media to fill the gaps. It does NOT replace the in-person face to face, voice to voice, and hand in hand. Go to the other service and meet new folks. Change where you sit in church. Stay after church or come early for food and fellowship. If you haven't been to church, COME TO CHURCH! ©

As your pastor, some have told me I have come a long way in getting to know people and their names (not just their names); but I still feel I have a ways to go. We learn names more easily if we learn more about the person and can associate things with them. Like when I solidified knowing Connie's name from the 11:00 service since she was walking and talking with me on the Langhorne Good Friday Cross Walk. We now have that in common and the relationship has more potential to grow from there. We were on a journey <u>together</u> with many others.

My friends, we all are on a journey together as the Langhorne United Methodist Church. Let us talk together as we walk together; let us lift each other and love each other as we take this church further in to the 21st century listening, learning, and growing TOGETHER, as we — with God's help — continue to perfect ourselves in Christian love and build the kingdom of God.

SUNDAY SCHOOL NEWS FOR CHILDREN

Finance Committee, Chuck Boyle, Chairperson

As of the end of April our church's financial status continues to be stable. Our year-to-date total income is a bit above expectations, our expenses are below expectations, and we have recorded a net gain year-to-date. So far so good, but there are still eight months left in the year. It is, though, a positive picture. We do have a wonderful church family.

Outlined for you below are the significant areas of our financial reporting that are coming in differently than what was budgeted for year-to-date through April 2018.

On the revenue side our total revenues equaled \$108,300, which is \$2,000 more than our budget. The major differences between our budget and actual revenue are noted below:

- 1. General offerings came in \$1,100 below the budget. This is actually an improvement over what was reported in February (we were \$5,000 short at the end of February).
- 2. Facility usage income is \$400 more than the budget. The use of our church by others is rather hard to predict and will fluctuate through the year.
- 3. Donations for flowers came in \$400 above the budget.
- 4. Wedding income is \$400 above the budget.
- 5. Our Wednesday night dinners are \$1,100 below the budget. Lyn Wallace, the founder and leader of this outreach program had personal medical matters to deal with and, as such, there were fewer dinners. We thank Lyn for her hard work and hear that she is feeling much better. The dinners are scheduled to start again in the fall of this year.
- 6. Investment returns from the McKay Fund are \$2,700 more than budget. This is most likely a timing issue that should correct itself over the year. The proceeds from this trust can come in at times that do not coincide with our monthly reporting.

On the expense side for the year we reported total expense of \$95,100, which is \$9,200 under our budget. The continued controlling of our expenses can result in a good bottom line this year. The hard work of our staff, committees, and congregation make this possible. The major differences between our budget and actual expenses are noted below:

- 1. Altar flower expense was \$400 more than the budget. Flower income is also up by \$400 and so the net bottom-line effect in this area is \$0.
- 2. Caring Ministries are \$300 under the budget.
- 3. Youth transportation was \$300 less than the budget.
- 4. Sunday School Curriculum is \$700 more than budget. Based on our decision to focus on making LUMC a wonderful home for young families this overage is totally acceptable.
- 5. Youth funding from the LUMC general account is \$500 more than budget. This will correct itself next month.
- 6. Pastor's Discretionary Fund is over budget by \$300. This is a timing error that will correct itself.
- 7. Music copyright fees are \$200 less than budgeted. This should correct itself over tim

- 8. Music supplies are \$500 more than budget. This is due to the purchase of a new sound board that is used in our sanctuary.
- 9. Choir director's compensation was \$2,800 less than the budget because this position has been combined with the organist position.
- 10. Health Insurance is \$400 under the budget. This is due to the budget being over estimated as actual cost projections were not available when the 2018 budget was created.
- 11. Church Secretary compensation was \$1.400 less than the budget. This position was reduced from two part-time professionals to one with extended hours for that person. The office also is now closed on Fridays.
- 12. Sexton compensation was \$1,100 less than the budget. This area will fluctuate over time based on the amount of hours worked.
- 13. Our Pastor's CPE allowance was \$800 less than the budget.
- 14. Social security tax expense was \$300 less than the budget because of a reduction in total staff compensation expenses.
- 15. Nursery worker compensation was \$200 more than the budget. This is a new expense that was not included in the 2018 budget. The cost of this position is fully funded by the savings account set up to support LUMC's young family focus.
- 16. Sexton supplies are \$200 less than budget.
- 17. Organ and piano maintenance are \$800 more than budget. This should correct itself over time as bills do not always match up with the budget on a monthly basis.
- 18. Utility expenses were \$200 less than the budget.
- 19. Telephone was \$200 more than budget.
- 20. Copier lease is \$500 less than budget. This should correct itself over time.
- 21. Taxes on our parsonage and rental home are \$2,700 under budget. This will correct itself next month when tax bills are paid.
- 22. Office operation expenses were \$1,000 less than the budget. This could correct itself over time as bills do not always match up with the budget on a monthly basis.

This leaves us with a year-to-date net operating gain of \$13,200, which is \$11,200 better than our budget. Financial stability is challenging to accomplish and maintain. Together, in 2018, we can achieve success.

As of the end of April we have \$57,900 in the L.U.M.C. general fund. This provides the financial cushion that we need.

The Reserve Giving Fund continues to grow nicely thanks to our congregation. As of the end of February the balance in this fund is \$14,200.


The Young Family Focus Fund has a current balance of \$9,800.

Faith promise offerings have improved over the last two months. Year-to-date income continues to be not enough to cover our missionary support expenditures but only by \$100. The u


balance is currently \$4,900. Hopefully this increase in income will continue. It is too early to tell if that will be the case but it is nice to see a positive improvement in this area.


The church audit for 2017 is very close to completion. Two areas were discovered that require resolution. The goal of the finance committee is to not just report areas that need attention but to report how these concerns have been addressed. We are working on resolutions to these concerns currently.


