#### Greetings!

March - - this year it makes up the main body of the season of Lent, it is Women's History month, it ushers in Spring (which, I think, many of us can agree, has already arrived!), and it has personal meaning for those celebrating, observing, or mourning various anniversaries. It got me thinking about what historic events happened in the month of March and the internet<sup>1</sup> gave up a few of interest:

*March 21, 1556* – The Archbishop of Canterbury, Thomas Cranmer, was burned at the stake by order of Queen Mary the First. Cranmer was archbishop under King Henry the Eighth and was instrumental in laying the foundations for what is now the Church of England and compiled the Common Book of Prayer. Mary, daughter of Henry and his first born with Katherine of Aragon (first wife), was a devout Roman Catholic and did her best to dismantle the Protestant Reformation in England. A lot of people died because of their religious beliefs - - Protestants under Mary; Catholics under her sister, Elizabeth; and thousands throughout Europe accused of heresy (different beliefs or thinking contrary to the majority rule at the time).

March 31, 1889 - The Eiffel Tower opened in Paris, France.

*March 4, 1918* – a strain of the flu struck first in the United States in Fort Riley, Kansas. By noon, 107 on base were in the infirmary; by the end of the week, 500 were infected; and by the end of the month, 1127 in Fort Riley and the surrounding area were infected. 46 died (4.1%). Back then, medicine was barely informed about the existence of things called "viruses" and thought the cause was a type of bacteria. Unfortunately, that was the only way they had to treat this flu. Because this happened during World War I, soldiers carried the flu to Europe where conditions were ripe to spread the disease in unsanitary conditions created by the war. It spread beyond the fighting to neutral countries like Spain. Because of the war and the need to restrict outside communications to the rest of the world, how the flu affected the war zones was not observed by the world; but it was noticed as it overcame Spain. And while conditions and loss of life were worse in the war zone, the world only associated the disease with Spain, and it became the "Spanish Flu." The flu spread worldwide leaving only one place on Earth untouched: the Island of Marajo off the coast of South America at the mouth of the Amazon River.

*March 1, 1932* – Charles Lindbergh Jr., the twenty month old son of the Lindberghs, was kidnapped making headlines across the nation as the son of the famous and popular pilot and his wife suffered greatly and never saw him alive again. The body was found not far from their home two months later in a wooded area on May 12.

There was not much that I found that was very positive. We tend to remember and record those things that make the greatest impact on our lives, and really concentrate a lot on the negative. And that is sad. We tend to be a drama-driven culture. Look at the soap operas that lasted so long until the birth of reality television brought bad behavior and over-blown egos and attitudes into the living rooms of western culture, and then to the world. People think nothing about insulting others or using bad language and it scares me to think about what behaviors have NOW become acceptable. Social media is abused and proves to be one of the primary vehicles for this cowardly and immature behavior. Whatever happened to love God and love your neighbor?

But there is hope for us, especially because we are Christians and we live in an age when technology can be a benefit rather than a vehicle for social and cultural erosion. We do not have to be and should not be so nasty and drama driven. We have encountered recent information regarding how our future might unfold as United Methodists; and, very recently, the scare of another potential pandemic caused by the Corona Virus. The people of 1918 were not as well prepared or as educated about such

things like the Spanish Flu as we are in the 21<sup>st</sup> century, and they suffered greatly. And we as Christians and United Methodists have our faith, resilience, and love to carry us through. We must rise up above what pulls the rest of the world down.

We are better equipped than ever to weather what this Earth and the earthly, human influences and temptations can throw at us! Let's tap into the Holy Spirit to guide us through these times. God has always advocated the use of wisdom – she stands there waiting for us to but ask...

the first of his acts of long ago.

at the first, before the beginning of the earth.

When there were no depths I was brought forth,

when there were no springs abounding with water.

Before the mountains had been shaped,

before the hills, I was brought forth-

when he had not yet made earth and fields, or the world's first bits of soil.

When he established the heavens, I was there,

when he drew a circle on the face of the deep,

when he made firm the skies above,

when he established the fountains of the deep,

when he assigned to the sea its limit,

then I was beside him, like a master worker;

We are now checking prices and availability of a new refrigerator, but of course, it's not going to be cheap!

2. The dishwasher wasn't working correctly - and it wouldn't drain completely. We bailed it out and found an assortment of silverware that had fallen down and was partially blocking the drain area. Removing the silverware and cleaning out the lime deposits seems to have solved the problem - say a prayer and keep your fingers crossed!

We will be making plans for the salad supper planned for May 12, and the May 9th Flea Market. Please join us for a night of enjoyable Christian fellowship.




## UNITED METHODIST WOMEN

#### Calkins Memorial Scholarship Award Application - 2020

Background - This memorial scholarship was established in 1978 after the tragic loss of Ellen Adele Calkins. While a senior enrolled at the University of Delaware, she was killed in an automobile accident at the young age of 21. This scholarship fund was later increased after the deaths of Jacqueline Calkins in 1987 and Frederic Calkins in 2015 to honor their memory, as well.

Qualifications -

- Candidate must be a sophomore, junior or senior in good academic standing at an accredited, recognized two-year or four-year institution.
- Candidate must be a member of Langhorne United Methodist Church by confirmation, transfer, or profession of faith.
- Candidate must complete this entire application legibly, then sign and date it. If the applicant is under 18 years of age, the application must be co-signed by the applicant's legal parent/guardian.


UMW prayer shawl team and all crocheting and knitting people: Would you like to help?
