Lent has come early this year. When you are reading this, it may be not too long before Easter. Then with the next issue of the Friendly Voice, summer will be fast approaching! Time flies ever faster before us with each passing day!

Those of us with little ones in our lives see this often as *bittersweet*. On the one hand, we are so excited to see growth taking place, new skills being learned, character and personality being developed, and mobility being mastered. Update from Aileen Agoncillo: I'm glad I got to join the Wycliffe News Network team for their 2nd annual meeting. Our team met in Cape Town where we participated in a consultation on missiology, gathered local stories, and did team building activities.

Right now our team does not have someone focused on identifying and pursuing possible stories to gather in the Asia area. When I'm able to join this team I'll fill that role and help the team to cover some of the countless stories of what God is doing in Asia!



In order for me to serve most effectively, Wycliffe requires that I have 100% of my needs committed through partners before I begin my new assignments with the Wycliffe News Network and Wycliffe Engage. Currently I am at about 64% of my monthly financial need.

Update from Paul & Donna Tocco: We are excited to commission and send off more graduates. This group of fine pastors and leaders were such a blessing to have here. They came with expectant hearts to receive from God and to be taught the Word of God. The students seemed to hang on every word that was taught and would put the Word into practice as they heard it. We had one leader from Uganda, a married couple from Western Kenya and others from other parts of Kenya. Rick and Sue McCoy, teachers from the U.S., did an outreach to the Sunday school teachers in the area and taught them how to minister to children using puppets and other methods.



Update from Steve & Gail Quigg: Great news to share - we've found an airplane! And have you ever seen one so beautiful?! The plane now has a new US registration and we just obtained the ferry permit. The Caravan is about to spread its wings and take flight. Our ferry pilot Stuart Mills left Tampa, Florida yesterday afternoon to make his way to Evenes, Norway to take delivery of the aircraft. If all goes well, he will leave Norway Saturday morning to wing his way south and then west with the final destination of Kidron, Ohio where the plane will be outfitted for mission service. After being outfitted in Ohio, it will be eventually going to Lubumbashi, Congo. Since his maximum range will be about 800 miles on a tank of gas, Stuart will spend four to six days hop-scotching his way across the North Atlantic, and in the middle of winter, no less.





So, here we are already writing for March and April. Time does fly!

On March 3rd Sunday School will finish up with their study of Mary Magdalene. Then we move on to the Easter story. See the tentative schedule below or check the schedule which is posted outside the Lounge for room assignments and activities.

The youth want to wish all of you a Happy Easter and to thank you again for your continued prayers and support!

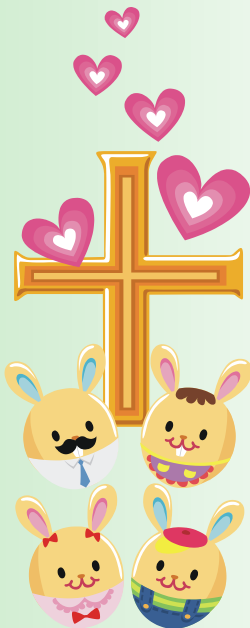

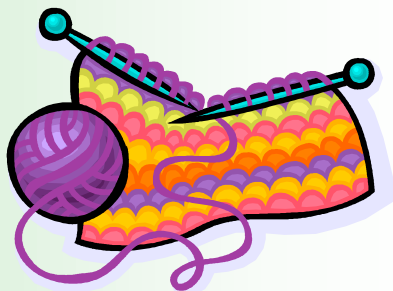

Items on our list include:

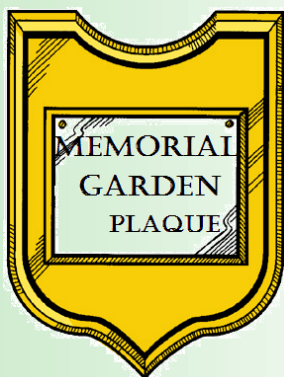
- ◆ chipping up the brush pile,

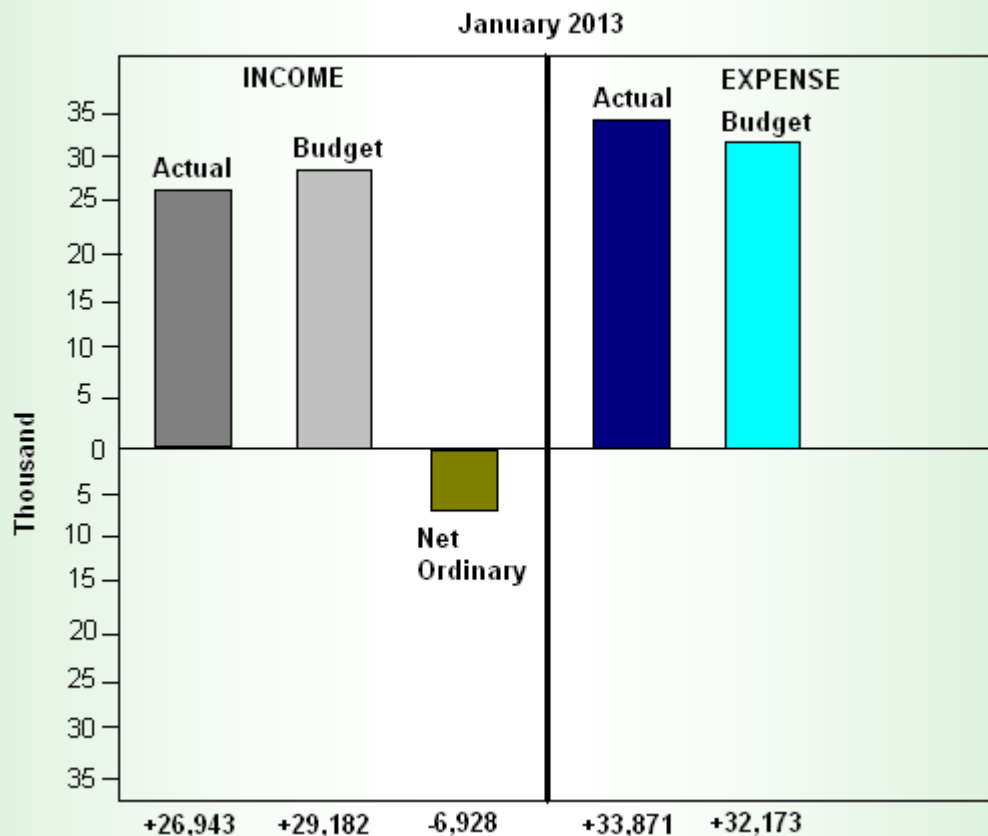

YOUR CHURCH FINANCES

As shown in the following graph, income for January was below budget because offerings were down \$2,000. This coupled with expenses exceeding budget by nearly \$1,700 and a budgeted short fall of nearly \$3,000 resulted in a negative net ordinary income of \$6,928. Obviously, negative income erodes our meager reserve balance and makes achieving our budget targets for the year more challenging.



In these uncertain times, it is only through the dedicated and faithful support of the congregation that we can maintain the church as a beacon of faith, comfort and hope for our community.

Raise the Roof Update

ROOF FUND

Over the last several years we have accrued \$505,000 in expenses to replace the roof on the entire church and replace broken trusses located in the sanctuary. Through generous donations, fund raising, a grant, insurance proceeds and memorial gifts we have been able to pay \$310,000. In order to pay for the entire project we took a ten year loan from the Eastern Pennsylvania United Methodist Conference in the amount of \$285,000.

As of January 31, 2013, after two years of regular monthly payments and a lump sum payment from a memorial gift our loan balance is \$195,000. This leaves us six years and three months of monthly payments of \$3,093.00 to pay off the loan.

The monthly payments are not in our budget. We are counting on the generosity of our members to cover the cost of the monthly payments. The roof is not a budgeted item because 100% of our current offerings are needed to continue the general needs of our church.
